Over 10 million visitors expected!

The 2020 Olympic and Paralympic Games will be held in Tokyo this summer. Over 10 million people, including athletes, event related personnel, media, spectators, and more will visit Tokyo during the event period. There is concern that serious traffic congestion will occur on the roads and public transit if we do not take any countermeasures.

Without any countermeasures during the Games...



Traffic congestion on the Metropolitan Expressway **will be doubled** due to traffic concentration.
Traffic congestion will occur on general roads in the mornings heading into central Tokyo.

The number of vehicles traveling on metropolitan expressways per day will increase by approximately 70,000.



Increased congestion on public transportation will result in **train delays and increased transfer times.**

A maximum of approximately 800,000 spectators, etc. will use railways each day.



If no measures or preparations are implemented, there is the possibility of increased risk of delays, such as by the movement of people and products being negatively affected.

For example,

- The conveyance of parts and the like will be delayed.
- Products will not be delivered to supermarkets and convenience stores and the like.
- Package deliveries will not be delivered on time.
- Maintenance and inspection engineers will be late.
- ATMs will run out of cash.
- People will be late to start work, or to have business meetings or negotiations.

It is important to **make preparations** to circumvent such risks, and to be able to continue stable economic activities during the events period.

First thing first, registration to the 2020 TDM Promotion Project is kindly requested for corporations.

When you register, you will receive by email or magazine **early information regarding traffic during the Tokyo Olympic and Paralympics events period.**

* There are no costs or obligations generated by registration.* Each department can also register on its own.

The 2020 TDM Promotion Project is organized and controlled by the Tokyo metropolitan government, the Cabinet Secretariat, and the Tokyo 2020 Organizing Committee. It is undertaking efforts to suppress traffic demands to enable both smooth event operations and conveyance for the Tokyo 2020 events, and maintaining a balance between economic activities.

Place a check mark to the following items if applicable.


- Have offices or business partners near competition venues
- Use highways
- Often use vehicles during daytime
- Often use home deliveries
- Work involves importing and exporting
- Have deliveries from the waterfront
- Frequently used routes pass areas that will be affected by the events

Check 2 Please prepare a 2020 action plan (action plan for the Games period)

1. Consider expected issues and measures



I'm worried about my employees coming to work on time

Place a check mark to items possible to implement.

- Take pre-planned holidays during the Games period
- Introduce staggered working hours
- Introduce the flex-time system
- Introduction of tele-work
- Substitute email and telephone calls for meetings
- Change your operating hours
- Working in line with the Games period
- Reduce waste



I'm worried about my deliveries won't be made on time

Place a check mark to items possible to implement.

◆ Necessary discussions to be made with shippers

- One extra day of lead time
- Simplify inspection
- Ship by avoiding the events period (ship before or after)
- Reduce the number of re-deliveries
- Change shipping and collection times

◆ Ingenuous efforts in your company

- Substantial amount of stock in advance
- Circumvent or detour congested regions
- Increase stacking efficiency (share, ensure return loads)
- Standardize pallets etc.

2. The items you check are Step 1 for your company's 2020 Action Plan

Step 1. Determine specific items to implement (what to do, and when to start)

Step 2. Organize your department and person in charge.

Step 3. Confirm implementation procedures

When preparing the 2020 action plan, you may also utilize individual consultations through the support system for implementation using consultants.
